BYLAWS OF PERRY COUNTY AMATEUR RADIO CLUB

December 23, 2021

Article I

Secretary

It shall be the duty of the Secretary to keep the constitution and By-Laws of the club and have the same with him/her at every meeting. He/she shall note all amendments, changes, and additions to the constitution and shall permit it to be consulted by members upon request.

Article II

Membership

Associate membership is open to those actively engaged in a class-leading to an Amateur Radio license and all other interested persons.

Full membership includes all club privileges as well as rights to hold a club office and to vote for club officers.

Associate membership includes all club privileges except for the right to hold office and vote for club officers. Applications for membership shall be submitted at regular meetings.

Article III

Meetings

Regular meetings shall be held on the 2nd Thursday of each calendar month. Special meetings may be called by the President upon the written request of any five club members. Notices shall be sent to members concerning special meetings and the business to be transacted. Only such business as designated shall be transacted. Such notices shall be sent so that they arrive not less than 24 hours before the meeting.

Article IV

Dues Fees and Assessments

Annual dues are waived and will be considered free until such addendums are adopted by the membership of the Club.

Termination of membership either by resignation or expulsion will not constitute a refund of dues paid.

Article V

Elections

Officer elections will be held every two years at the regular November meeting.

Officers will assume their elected office on January 2nd of the following year.

Nomination Committee

- 1. The President will appoint a nomination committee six months prior to elections.
- 2. The committee will be charged with finding qualified candidates to run for office.
- 3. The committee will present a ballot to the president at the regular meeting one month prior to
- 4. elections at which time the President will entertain a motion for nominations and accept the ballot.
- 5. The final ballot will be published and made available to all club members by mail.
- 6. The president will dissolve the nomination committee after the annual elections.

Voting

- 1. Voting will be done using paper ballots or electronically if held virtually
- 2. Immediately after voting the ballots will be counted openly in front of the membership.
- 3. Any candidate may request a recount of the ballots.
- 4. In the case of an unopposed slate, the President may entertain a motion for the Secretary to cast a single ballot.

Article VI

Interference committee

This committee shall consist of five members (appointed by the club President). The committee shall direct investigation, invite proper inquires, establish technical facts and testimony and report its results to the club.

Article VII

Amateur Radio Emergency service – ARES ®

ARES® is a program of the American Radio Relay League -- our club will abide by the Rules and Regulations of the ARRL's Field Organization as they may be amended from time to time, and by ARRL policies, rules, and guidelines contained in ARRL publications."
